The runway, designated 27, was 550 metres long with a smooth, dry, grass surface. The undershoot area was covered by a crop of wheat up to the threshold. The surface wind was reported as 360°/4-5 kt. On the final stage of the approach the aircraft came into contact with the standing wheat and somersaulted onto the runway. It came to rest the right way up but, shortly after impact, the cable between the full shoulder harness fitting and the fuselage mounting point failed. However, the pilot suffered only minor facial injuries and escaped unaided from the wreckage.
